Postcard from Mrs. (Mabel Hubbard) Alexander Graham Bell to Dr. Alexander Graham Bell. (Postmarked Nantucket, Mass. July 30th) 1876? Saturday.

Have no time for a letter. Have not heard from you. We called on Mrs. L. last night and were charmed into staying more than two hours. We are both so sorry that she left this morning. Who do you suppose was in bathing today? A. Martin, the young man who rescued me last summer. I wonder I ever liked him. We did not meet and I hope will not. The waves were somewhat high, but not very strong undertow.

Miss Elliot leaves Wednesday or Thursday. Carrie, Miss E. and I are going into town on another spree which we hope will be more successful than the last.
