

Letter from Alexander Graham Bell to Mabel Hubbard Bell, March 20, 1896, with transcript

Alexander Graham Bell to Mabel (Hubbard) Bell. Wausau, Wisconsin, Friday, March 20, 1896. My darling Mabel:

Been hard at work at Wausau school today — good ordinary school — nothing remarkable about it — excepting the exaggerated pronunciation of R ([??][??][??])!!

Miss Margaret Sullivan, Principal. Miss Murphy, assistant. They have a parents' society here. I addressed a meeting of parents and friends this afternoon — and have now to go to supper with Miss Sullivan and Miss Murphy. After supper I address a public meeting and then rush for the train for Marshfield. I enclose telegram from Mr. McCurdy; and a letter from the Students of the Illinois College. Must stop now.
