

Letter from Alexander Graham Bell to Mabel Hubbard Bell, April 23, 1917

Beinn Bhreagh, near Baddeck, Nova Scotia. 1917 April 23 Mrs Alexander Graham Bell
1331 Connecticut Avenue Washington D C Dear Mabel:—

The “Gauldrie” is being launched this afternoon so we will soon have a motor boat that can be used for towing experiments.

The “Kia Ora” is imprisoned in her shed by an immense collection of sand at the mouth of the canal. It will be a tremendous job to remove it.

I enclose three pages of Recorder material for Miss Mackenzie for your information, please see that Miss Mackenzie gets it without delay.
