

## Letter from Edward M. Gallaudet to Alexander Graham Bell, April 12, 1877, with transcript

Gallaudet, President of the National Deaf-mute College, (now Columbia Institution) to Alexander Graham Bell, stating that he would be pleased to have Dr. Bell "connected with the work of this college."
