The Jordahls are the owners of the almanac stick which they loaned to the museum to be copied. They also have a spinning wheel which they say is several hundred years old. There is not a piece of metal in it—it is put together with wooden pegs. The wheel is about a foot and a half in diameter. The entire thing is beautifully finished and not crude appearing in appearance as so many are. On the side of the spinning wheel is painted the initials of the original owner. They are S E D B and represent Synava Engval Datter Busness, which means Engval Busness' daughter Synova. Mrs. Jordahl also has the cards with which her mother would card the wool preparatory to spinning it. They are about eight inches square.
