Abelardo was one of the second generation of Higuera clan at Rancho Agua Caliente which was granted to Don Fulgencio in 1834. Two and possibly four brothers and their sons occupied portions of rancho and acquired additional adjoining lands.

This adobe occupied later by Arthur Curtner, son of Henry Curtner, who acquired a portion of Rancho. Building now in unredeemable ruins.

Description: Rectangular one-story and attic story adobe building with shake roof with unusually little overhang at eaves and rake of gable ends.
