Builder: Daniel Hill, a carpenter and mason from Massachusetts.


Present Condition: Well preserved and cared for, present owners occupy south half of building for its own offices, north end vacant.

Number of stories: One.

Materials of construction: Foundations of field stone. Walls of sun dried adobe brick laid in adobe mortar, plastered both sides and white washed on exterior, oil painted on interior. Roof framed of rough logs with modern tile roof laid over old shingles. Floors of pine painted. Corridor floor brick; Fire places added in recent years.

Other existing records: H. H. Bancroft, "History of California". Walter A. Hawley, "The Early Days of Santa Barbara"; Myrtle Garrison, "The Romance and History of California Ranchos", Hero Eugene Rensch, "Historic Spots in California." The Southern Counties.

Additional Data: This house was purchased a few years after it was built by Joaquin Carrillo and has since been known as the Carrillo House. House seems to have but few changes made to its original design. Additions to the rear of the building are modern. This house was the home of Captain John Wilson and later of Guillermo Carrillo. The first city Council met there in 1850. Here also was born its first child of American parents in Santa Barbara, Isobel, the daughter of Thomas O. Larkin, first American Consul in California. Home was purchased by Major Max C. Fleishmann in 1928 to be preserved as one of the historic buildings of Santa Barbara and given to the Santa Barbara Foundation.
