THADDEUS GOODE HOLT HOUSE
Macon, Bibb County, Georgia

Owner: Mr. and Mrs. A. M. Peeler.

Date of Erection: Probably between 1830 and 1840.

Architect: Elam Alexander.

Present Condition: Good; Portico of metal columns on S.E. was added later. Round silver balls on newell post have disappeared. Formerly had wood parapet similar to Ralph Small House.

Number of Stories: Two and basement.

Materials of Construction: Foundation masonry stuccoed; wood floors; exterior walls frame; wood columns; interior walls plastered.

Other Existing Records: Picture in Plantation Slavery in Georgia by Ralph Betts Flanders. Article by Mary Callaway Jones, Macon Telegraph, Oct. 23, 1927. Measured drawings by Oliver M. Riley, Donaldsville Georgia. Spain Willingham made rendered perspective for owner which hangs in hall.

Additional Data: Built by Judge Holt. Has six fluted shafts with Greek Doric capitals supporting entablature. Heavy beautifully paneled doors intact; door and window tracings have carved rosette motives at corners. Paneling under windows only. Floors hard Georgia pine. White marble mantels. LaFayette visited in 1825. Thaddeus Goode Holt, Jr. occupied house after father's death 1873. Sold to Danenbergs, then to Martins, then to Dure, - restoration by Duke.
