

Architectural Description : Plan type : vernacular tee with front porch inbetween stems and irregular rear additions  
Foundation: coursed ashlar stone perimeter walls; concrete block  
Structure : wood frame  
Ext. walls: beveled siding with plain corner boards  
Roof: asphalt shingled, moderately pitched gables over stems of main section tee; shed roof over front porch and rear additions  
Dormers: none  
Windows: 1/1 double-hung with sloped dripcaps and plain board casings and slip sills  
Porches: open porch on west side of north stem  
Details: decorative scroll-sawn porch brackets and turned porch columns, moulded horizontal and raking cornices with plain board friezes

Construction Date : ca. 1910  
Architecture Style: Vernacular Tee  
Statement of Significance: The westernmost house in a primarily black neighborhood known historically as the East End (and presently as the Hampton Wedge), this frame building has been rented or vacant since its construction. It is one of many modest vernacular structures in the area, altered and added onto several times - a typical example of its genre.
