MUSICIANS STOPPED UNASKED AT NO. 196 GREEN STREET  
OPPOSITE THE SOUTHEAST GABLE OF THE BUILDING AND I HEARD  
THEM PLAY THE GERMAN SONG SHOWN BELOW, TRANSLATED  
'WE HAD BUILT A STATELY HOUSE,  
AND DEDICATED IT TO GOD,  
AGAINST RAIN, STORM AND DISASTER'  
I CALLED THEM BACK TO PLAY IT AGAIN, BUT THEY MISUNDER-  
STOOD ME AND WENT AWAY.
