Historical Data:

When Charleston was the capital of the colony, and after the city had grown far beyond its original walls, the State House stood on the N. W. corner of Meeting and Broad Streets. This was burned in 1788, and as the capital had been removed to Columbia, there was no reason for its rebuilding. On the site, in fact, on the very foundations, there was erected the Court House. It was designed to face on Broad Street, but subsequently, the interior was remodelled and the main entrance thrown on Meeting Street.
