THE ARMS OF NOTT, granted in 1587. (See Edmondson's 'Heraldry.') ARMS.—*Azure, on a bend between three leopards' faces or, as many martlets gules.* CREST.—*A martlet argent, ducally crowned or, holding in beak an olive branch vert.* But Arms are ascribed to Nott in Stow's 'Survey of London,' p. 554 (edition 1632), to John Nott, 1363, Lord Mayor. He was Sheriff, 1350 (page 552).

EARLY DATA OF NOTT.—John Nott, citizen and pepperer, twice Lord Mayor of London, 1363—1367, temp. Edw. III. John, the son of John Nott of Aynford or Ashford, in Kent, 1587. The original Nott Motto was "Nil desperandum," changed to "Pacem sed Coronatam." The Crest and Motto were changed temp. Charles II.

CROMWELL, NEALE, NOTT, ETC.

Sir Richard Williams assumed the name of Cromwell from his maternal uncle, Frances, dau'r and coheir of Sir Thos. Murphyn, Thos. Cromwell, Earl of Essex, and was of Hinchinbrook. Knighted by Hen. Lord Mayor of London. Married 1518. VIII., 1540. Living 1542.

Sir Henry Cromwell of Hinchinbrook, knighted by Q. Eliz., 1563. Died 1603. Joan, dau'r and heir of Sir Ralph Warren, Knt., Lord Mayor of London 1536; ob. 12 Oct. 1584.
