hospitality and esteem
to the 93rd year of his age And surviving his second lady who died on the 4th day
of June 1754
only a few months he departed this life on the 20th day of December in the same year.

WILLS AND ADMINISTRATIONS.

Dame Anne Raymond.

Will dat. 26 May 1709; pr. 14 Sept. 1709 by Sir Jemmett Raymond son and Ex'or. My late father Phillip Jemmett Esq. dec^d by his will gave my son Jemmett Raymond (now Sir Jemmett) certain almshouses at Newbury, Berks, in trust for 12 poor people. Quotes Ind're 18 Apr. 1705, bet. her husb. Sir Jonathan Raymond and herself of 1 part, and John Blandy and Wm. Barnesley Esq^{rs} of the other part, and another Ind're (24 Nov. 1703) betw. her son Sir Jemmett Raymond of 1 part, and her husb^d and herself of the 2nd p^t, James Stredwick of 3^d part, and Samuel Parker and Wm. Barnesley Esq^{rs} for raising certain monies for purposes of her will. To my son Sir Jemmett Raymond £400 in trust, to be laid out in land the rents to be for the use of my da. Elizabeth during life of her husband and if she dies before him, then to her children during his life, and after his decease, out of the s^d rents, to each of the s^d 12 poor people sixpence a week for ever. I desire to be bur^d in Kintbury Church near my late father, and my husband to raise a monument to me and all my eleven children. To my cousin Anne Gardiner widow £6 yearly for life. Mourning to be given to my children Sir Jemmett Raymond and Elizabeth his wife, Sir John Chetwood, M^r Tho^s Blackmore and Anne his wife, Elizabeth Loder, M^r Henshaw and Mabel his wife and all their child^{rn}. Mourning rings to my friends M^{rs} Savage, M^{rs} Feltham, and M^{rs} Sargeant, da^r of M^r Ralph Bowes, dec^d, and to M^r Barnesley and his wife and son. Plate, &c. to my son Sir Jemmett Raymond

(Ex'or) and to my grandson Jemmett Raymond. My friend M^r Jone Hinton of Newbury, £10. Witnesses, Walter Harte, Bernard Hore, Will. Wallis. (P.C.C., 227 Lane.)

Mem. Sir Jonathan Raymond gives consent to the above will.

Sir Jemmett Raymond of Barton, co. Berks, Knt.

Will dat. 22 Oct. 1743; pr. 12 May 1755 by Jemmett Raymond, Esq., son and Ex'or. To my wife Lady Raymond all my estate at Henwick and Shaw in the parishes of Thatcham and Shaw, and at Harwell co. Berks for life, rem^t to my dau. Elizabeth and the heirs of her body, rem^t to my son Jemmett. To my da. Elizabeth £100 a year during my wife's life. To my s^d wife all my stock and household staff, and her Jewels, &c. Residue to my son Jemmett Raymond, sole Ex'or. I desire to be bur^d in Kintbury Church in a private manner. Witnesses, Hannah Harte, Rob^t Gapper, Ambrose Keill. (P.C.C., 142 Paul.)

Jonathan Raymond, late of Barton, co. Berks, bach^r, dec^d.

Adm'on 8 Feb. 1737-8 to his father Sir Jemmett Raymond, Knt. Adm'on (*de bonis non*) 12 May 1755 to Jemmett Raymond, Esq., son and Ex'or of Sir Jemmett Raymond now dec^d. (P.C.C., Adm'ons 1738.)

Jemmett Raymond of Wolverton, par. of Wolverton, co. Southamp., Esq.

Will dat. 12 July 1755; proved 13 Oct. 1767 by the Hon. Elizabeth Raymond, formerly Eliz. Craven, widow, the relict and Ex'trix. To be buried in a private manner in Kintbury Church. All my lands, ten'ts, &c., in the Co^s of Midd. Berks and Southampton to the Hon. Elizabeth Craven of Crookham in the par. of Thatcham, Berks, widow of the Hon. Cha^s Craven, late of the same place, for her life, and after her death I give the lands, &c. in co. Southampton to my cousin Dame Elizabeth Miller and the heirs of her body, and the lands, &c. in Co^s Midd. and Berks to my sister Elizabeth, and the heirs of her body, rem^t to my right heirs. Bequests to servants. All my shares in the Chelsea waterworks, and plate, furniture, &c. to the afs^d Eliz. Craven, she to be sole Ex'trix. To my sister Elizabeth furniture, &c. in the house at Harwell, and also my stock of deer in my park at Wolverton. Witnesses, Jane Craven, Hannah Doore, W^m Robbins, Rector of Wolverton.

Codicil dat. 27 May 1756. I have, since making my will, intermarried with the afs^d Elizabeth Craven. The devise to Dame Elizabeth Miller is void by her death, and I give the s^d lands to her da. Dame Elizth Worsley and the heirs of her body. Witnesses, Jane Craven, Ja. Gilpin, John Walton.

Second Codicil, 30 Sept. 1763. Since making my will I have settled certain of my estates by deed, and in lieu of the former bequest, I now give to my sister Elizabeth now wife of the Rev. M^r John Craven and the heirs of her body, my manor of ffarmborough, Berks, rem^t to my cousin Sir Philip Touchet Chetwode, Bar^t, he to pay my cousin W^m Fullerton grandson of my Aunt Blackmore an annuity of £50 for life. Fee farm rents of certain lands in co. Berks to my cousin John Raymond, Esq. The manor of Henwick, &c. (after my wife's death) to my cousin Tho^s Henshaw of Bussock Court, par. of Cheiveley, Berks, Esq., he to pay my cousin Philip Fullerton, another grandson of my Aunt Blackmore, an annuity of £50 for life. If I survive my wife, I give £100 each for mourning to the afs^d M^r John Craven and Elizab. his wife, and to M^{rs} Eliz. Cox, M^{rs} Jane Fowle, M^{rs} Martha Lloyd, M^{rs} Marg^t Hincksman, and M^{rs} Mary Bishop, sisters of the s^d John Craven, and dau'rs of my s^d wife. The afs^d Tho^s Henshaw at a cost of £200 to erect a monument in Kintbury Church to my late father Sir Jemmett Raymond with 3 busts, one of himself and one of each of his wives, unless such monument be erected by me or my wife. The furniture, &c. at Barton House to my s^d sister Eliz. Craven. The furniture and deer at Wolverton, and such plate as hath the arms of the Browns or Worsleys engraven thereon to the afs^d dame Eliz. Worsley to whom

(in the first codicil) I have already given my estate at Wolverton. Rings of 21^s to M^{rs} Tipping, M^r Tipping, D^r Musgrave and wife, M^r Henshaw and wife, M^r Harry Henshaw, the s^d M^r John Craven and wife, the s^d M^{rs} Cox and husb., M^{rs} fowle and husb., M^{rs} Lloyd and husb., M^{rs} Bishop and husb., M^{rs} Hincksman and husb., M^r John Raymond and wife, and the s^d dame Elizth Worsley. Certain Bond, Securities, &c. to be realized and the monies to be in the hands of the s^d Tho^s Henshaw in trust for the benefit of the afs^d five dau^{rs} of my s^d wife, and their children. Witn., Ann Paice, Eliz. Tull, Ja^s Head.

Third Codicil, 5 June 1765. Poor of Kintbury, Thatcham, Wolverton, and Farnborough, £50. My godson [*blank*] Worsley son of Dame Eliz. Worsley. Gives plate, pictures, &c., to divers persons s^orement^d, viz., M^r Tipping, Tho^s Henshaw and wife, M^{rs} fowle wife of Rev. Tho^s fowle, M^r John Craven and wife Elizth. To Dame Eliz. Worsley all the pictures at Wolverton, except that of M^r Skillyng which I give to my sister Eliz. Craven. Witn., Eliz. Weeks, Anne Collis, Ja. Head.

On 27 June 1800 Adm^on was granted to Geo. Basten of Lincolns Inn gent., on behalf of Mary Anne Wroughton and her husb. the Rev. Philip Wroughton, clerk, as concerning the Manor of Bassett Fee and other lands in Sussex as ment^d in an Iud^{re} (17 Apr. 1705). Jane Fowle wife of the Rev. Tho^s Fowle (da. and surviving Ex^{tr}ix of the s^d Eliz. Raymond formerly Craven) dying intestate.

On 31 Mar. 1802, further Adm^on to Martha Lloyd, widow, da. of the afs^d Hon. Eliz. Raymond formerly Craven dec^d. (P.C.C., 387 Legard.)

I shall be most grateful for any information as to the ancestors of Sir Jonathan Raymond, and had he a brother John Raymond, and, if so, who did he marry and what issue had he? Is John Raymond, named in the will of Jemmett Raymond as his cousin, the same John Raymond (of Tower Hill, London; Hatchlands, Surrey; and Horn Park, Eltham; M.P. for Melcombe Regis; and a Brewer, who died at Battersea Rise 20 January 1782, aged 70) whose will is referred to in 'Miscellanea Genealogica et Heraldica,' Vol. III., N.S., page 215, and who married Britannia and Mary, the daughters of James Lambe of Hackney, and whose father was Samuel Raymond of London, Merchant, who died 7 September 1730, having married, 2 March 1707-8, at St. Giles, Cripplegate, Anne, daughter of Nicholas Skinner of London, Merchant? See 'Le Neve's Knights,' and Hunter's Fam. Min. Gentium, Add. MS. 24,458, British Museum. I believe Ann Whitley (see 'Burke's Commoners,' vol. iii., page 115) was a great-great-grand-daughter of Sir Jonathan Raymond through his eldest daughter Elizabeth, who married Thomas Loder of Balston Park, Kintbury (for Loder of Balston Park see Visitation of Berkshire 1664-6), or was Ann Whitley descended from Sir Jonathan Raymond through his third daughter Mary, who married 13 September 1695 at Allhallows Church, in the City of London, Sir John Chetwode, Bart., and had, *inter alios*, Anne, who married Thomas Whitley of Aston (see 'Miscellanea Genealogica et Heraldica,' Vol. I., Second Series, pages 76, 88, and 334)? Can any one throw light on Sir Jonathan Raymond's will, which is not to be found at the Probate Office, Somerset House? Is anything known of Sir Jonathan Raymond's children (he had eleven in all according to the M.I. at Kintbury), besides his son Sir Jemmett Raymond and his daughters Mrs. Thomas Loder and Lady Chetwode (and in Dame Anne Raymond's will M^{rs} Thomas Blackmore and M^{rs} Henshaw)? From John Raymond of Hatchlands, Surrey, M.P., etc., are descended the families of Raymond-Barker of Fairford Park, Gloucestershire; Brine of Lower Hardres, Kent; Wansey; Colfox of Bridport; Warren of Handcross Park, Crawley, Sussex, etc.; Nettlefold; Nias of Bath; Hill; Brocas of Beaurepaire, Hampshire; Rice (Lord Dynevor); and By of Shernfold Park, Sussex.
