Summary: The collection primarily consists of World War I military maps created by Willard B. Prince, a cartographer who served in the American 5th Division during the war. An incomplete set of Princes' letters and photographic materials are part of the collection. After the war, Prince conceived of the idea for the Heisman Trophy for the Downtown Athletic Club. A limited number records related to that history are present.

Biographical Note

<i>Date</i>	<i>Event</i>
1889-1910	Born and raised in Beverly, Massachusetts, where he attended school. Entered college at the Boston School of Fine Arts and graduated in 1910.
1917-1918	Became a cartographer and sergeant in the American Expeditionary Force during World War I. Prepared intelligence maps for the 5th Division, which saw combat in the Voges, St. Mihiel, Argonne Meuse and East of the Meuse offenses. Designed the Division's crest. Prince was the first American trained in aerial photography under the French at Chaumont. Received the Verdun Medal and the Silver Star for bravery on the battlefield. Kept a diary of his wartime experiences.
1919	Promoted to Regimental Sergeant Major.
1935	Elected chairman of the Downtown Athletic Club and designed the Heisman Memorial Trophy.

Scope and Content Note

Consists principally of maps, some annotated, of western France and of individual territories and regions of France during World War I. In addition, there are postcards, photocopied aerial views (many negatives) of ancient cities and fortresses, as well as various letters. Materials related to his work with the Downtown Athletic Club and creation of the Heisman Trophy are available.
