Scope and Content Note

The papers of David Herbert Lawrence (1885-1930) span the years 1921-1930 and consist mainly of holograph letters from Lawrence to Mabel Dodge Luhan. Many of these letters were published in Luhan's book *Lorenzo in Taos* (1932), which recounts her relationship with Lawrence and his time in Taos, New Mexico. The correspondence and notes in these papers begin in the year prior to Lawrence's arrival in New Mexico and end with his death. Subjects include Lawrence's travels and his experiences in Taos with Luhan and her husband, Tony, a Native American. Lawrence also discusses his writing projects, including the private printing of and reaction to his novel, *Lady Chatterley's Lover*, and offers comments on Luhan's writings. Included in the correspondence are notes from Lawrence's wife, Frieda, and a letter from Havelock Ellis.
