Scope and Content Note

The papers of William Hemsley Emory (1846-1917) span the years 1877-1948, with the bulk of the material falling in the years 1894-1906. The papers relate primarily to Emory's experience as commander of the cruiser *Yosemite* in the Spanish-American War. Materials related to the *Yosemite* include a letterbook, Emory's personal journal, conduct and rating books, printed log, and letters inquiring about discipline of the crew, which was composed of naval reserve men from Michigan. Two of the crew were Edwin Denby and Truman Handy Newberry, who would be future secretaries of the navy. In the printed matter are memoirs of crew members Mortimer E. Cooley, Henry B. Joy, Charles B. King, and Joseph S. Stringham.

Also included in Emory's papers are two personal letterbooks; correspondence containing orders to duty, letters from naval officers, and invitations; and photographs. Among the correspondents are George William Coffin, John Davis Long, Cyrus E. Lothrop, and Truman Handy Newberry.
