Scope and Content Note

The papers of Samuel Hay Kauffmann (1829-1906) span the years 1871-1896 and pertain primarily to his research on equestrian statues. Items include correspondence, research notes, printed matter, and drafts of a paper on the subject that Kauffmann delivered before the Literary Society of Washington. Correspondents include Joseph Alexis Bailly, Truman Howe Bartlett, Benj French & Co., and Joesph Edgar Boehm.
