Abstract: Naturalist and U.S. Army surgeon. Correspondence, reports, printed matter, newspaper clippings, and miscellaneous material chiefly relating to Mearns's activities as a collector of data on animal and plant life, on his participation in the Smithsonian African Expedition of 1909, and his duties and assignments as an army surgeon.

1892-1894	Explored boundary area from El Paso, Tex. to San Clemente Island, collecting flora and fauna in the region
1894-1903	Continued natural history investigations while stationed at Fort Myer, Va.; Fort Clark, Tex.; Fort Adams, R.I.; and Fort Yellowstone
1903-1907	Served two separate terms of duty in Philippine Islands
1909	Retired from army with rank of lieutenant colonel Naturalist, Smithsonian African Expedition, on invitation of Theodore Roosevelt
1911-1912	Visited Africa on a scientific expedition
1916, Nov. 1	Died, Washington, D.C.

Scope and Content Note

The papers of Edgar Alexander Mearns (1856-1916) span the years 1864-1918, with the bulk of the material concentrated in the period 1876-1916. The collection consists primarily of correspondence, supplemented by reports, printed matter, newspaper clippings, and miscellaneous material. The papers are organized into six series: [Family Correspondence](#), [General Correspondence](#), [Military Correspondence](#), [Special Correspondence](#), [Miscellany](#), and [Oversize](#).

The collection focuses on Mearns's career as a naturalist and army officer. Correspondence dealing with his activities as a collector of data on animal and plant life and as an army surgeon is scattered throughout the collection, but the [Special Correspondence](#) series mainly pertains to Mearns's scientific concerns whereas the [Military Correspondence](#) series deals with his army duties. The [Miscellany](#) includes reports, printed matter, and clippings relating to both scientific and military matters.

Mearns's private and family papers form the basis of the [Family Correspondence](#) series, and a large portion of the [General Correspondence](#) consists of letters from personal friends and colleagues. Both series also contain references to Mearns's scientific activities. A section of the [Special Correspondence](#) relating to the Smithsonian African expedition of 1909 includes several letters from Theodore Roosevelt.
