Material relating to the League of Nations and the control of narcotic drugs, including mimeographed and printed matter originating from the proceedings of the League of Nations Advisory Committee on Traffic in Opium and Other Dangerous Drugs, in reports of the committee to the League of Nations Council, minutes of the Council, and reports of league members.

Scope and Content Note

The collection of Ellen Newbold La Motte (1873-1961) on opium traffic spans the years 1919-1933 and consists mainly of material relating to the League of Nations and the control of narcotic drugs, including mimeographed and printed matter originating from the proceedings of the League of Nations Advisory Committee on Traffic in Opium and Other Dangerous Drugs, in reports of the committee to the League of National Council, minutes of the Council, and reports of league members.
