


Looking aft from amidships to the 2,400-horsepower Diesel engines. The Deutschland is equipped with these.


WHAT THE INNARDS OF THE DEUTSCHLAND LOOK LIKE

These are not pictures of the German undersea merchantman, but of an American-built submarine, the Isaac Pearl, one of several sold to the British government. They were delivered by way of Canada and crossed the Atlantic under their own power. The Deutschland is said to be almost a replica, mechanically, of the Isaac Pearl. 
Looking forward from amidships to the gyroscopic compasses, submerging levers and steering mechanism.
