


Lieutenant Alwyn Levy, Brooklyn. Attached to the Royal Flying Corps. Son of Bert Levy, the cartoonist and actor.

Paul G. Osborn, Montclair, N. J. Killed in France while serving with American Ambulance Corps.

First Lieutenant Oliver Burr Sherwood, Brooklyn. Killed in France.

Lieutenant Edmond J. La Porte, Plainfield, N. J. Died in France.

Major Charles G. Baird, Richmond Hill, L. I. Died in France. Superintendent of telegraph and telephone traffic of the A. E. F.



Ensign Walker Ten Eyck Weed, of Montclair, N. J. Died at Cape May as the result of a hydro-aeroplane accident.

Lieutenant Wilmer E. Herr. Killed in action on the Western front.

Alden Davison, of New York. Killed while flying at Hicks Field, Texas.

Lieutenant Briggs K. Adams, Montclair, N. J. Killed in action. He was a member of the Royal Flying Corps.



Cadet Samuel Walker Arnheim, R. F. C., of New York. Killed in airplane accident at Camp Hicks, Texas.

Sergeant Carl G. Shew, of Brooklyn. Killed in action.

Lieutenant Colonel William N. Michell, of New York. Wounded in France. Died in America.

Lieutenant Walter L. Johnson, Jersey City. Killed in airplane accident at Kelly Field, Texas.

Captain Edward McClure Peters, Brooklyn. Killed in action.
