

Captain Elliot P. Hinds, U. S. A. C., 12th Aero Squadron, Niagara Falls, N. Y. Killed in action.




Lieutenant John C. Rosenwald, Medical Corps, 151st F. A., Minneapolis. Died of wounds in France.
