Corporal John H. Gibson, 402nd Motor Truck Train Corps, Greenwich, Conn. Died in the service.




Lieutenant James Cowan Andes, 16th U. S. Regulars, New York City. Killed in action.

Private Edward R. Murray, U. S. M. C., New York City. Died of wounds received in action.




Corporal Alois Pchlaikowski, 127th Infantry, Milwaukee, Wis. Killed in action.
