


Private Charles Bartlett Weathered, jr., Co. F, 165th Infantry, New York. Killed in action.

Private James Marsden Percival, Co. I, 106th Infantry, Brooklyn. Killed in action.




Corporal Frank Berte Brady, Co. B, 107th Infantry, New York City. Died of wounds received in action.
